Purpose		The 'circulaire' of the Ministry of Environment of June 6, 2006, takes into application the Decree of 19 January 2006 amending the Decree of 9 September 1997 concerning the household waste storage facilities, and encourages the biodegradation of waste before burial ;	
Relevance to the biomethane sector		<p><b>4. Accelerated biodegradation:</b> The order has now explicitly taken into account an operating mode based on the principle of increasing biogas production kinetics controlled recirculation of water or leachate. This mode aims to accelerate the degradation of organic matter and therefore to limit the post-operation period.</p> <p><b>Article 19 – Captage du biogaz:</b> Previously the biogas collection was needed for records including waste from the category D. The decree of January 19, 2006 provides that any records receiving biodegradable waste is subject to an assessment of the biogas production. The production curve is in function of the nature of the waste which is acceptable, the size of the record, storage conditions and duration of the exploitation. The operator, from production of consolidated data for all records, must study the technical and economic feasibility of a biogas collection and assess risks and nuisances related to residual biogas emissions. (...)</p> <p><b>Article 31 – Nuisances olfactives:</b> The establishment of a temporary network of biogas collection during the operations phase is the most effective solution to prevent odors. Its implementation must however be assessed on the expected operating conditions and risks incurred. The destruction of the biogas received by the interim network is subject to the same requirements as the biogas captured by the final network.</p>
